KNIT. CROCHET. PRAY.

Throughout the centuries, shawls have been made to provide comfort, warmth and protection for the elements. Today's Prayer Shawls are handmade gifts of well wishes, into which blessings and intentions have been lovingly stitched with prayers for the recipient, offering comfort and warmth of a different kind. With this in mind, people who love to knit and crochet have picked up their needles, hooks and yarn to use their love of their craft to make a thought filled gift for someone special,

creating a gift from their heart.

Similar to praying, spiritual practice involves adding prayer or blessings from our minds and hearts to the work in our hands.

Who will receives the Prayer Shawl?

Prayer shawls often begin with a specific person in mind but they may also be inspired by an intriguing stitch pattern or a tempting yarn. Even if we do not have a specific person in mind, as our projects progress, we might learn of someone who is in need of a shawl.

How can you use the time making a Prayer Shawl as a spiritual experience?

To create a peaceful surrounding and to enhance your quiet, reflective knitting time, prepare your shawl-making space by lighting a candle, playing some quiet music and making yourself a cup of tea.
